About the Fraser Centre

The BC SUPPORT Unit Fraser Centre offers a number of services, for free, to teams involved in patientoriented research (POR) and/or knowledge translation (KT) and implementation in the Fraser region, described in the side bars.

POR is research that engages patients as partners, focuses on patient-identified priorities, and is conducted by multidisciplinary teams in partnership with all stakeholders. A patient partner is anyone with personal experience of a health issue or the health system including informal caregivers, such as family and friends.

The Fraser Centre, jointly administered by Fraser Health and Simon Fraser University, is one of five regional centres across BC connected to the BC SUPPORT Unit. There are eleven SUPPORT Units across the country as part of Canada's Strategy for Patient-Oriented Research led by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. The BC SUPPORT Unit is a component of the BC Academic Health Science Network.

Training & capacity building

We provide support in developing award and grant applications for POR and KT projects.

In addition, we offer various workshops & courses including: the national curriculum on POR, which includes 3 modules (health research, patientoriented research & team building); Why, what and how of patient engagement; Why, what and how of knowledge translation; and tailored workshops in these topic areas.
